Divine Mercy Sunday is celebrated on the <u>Second Sunday of Easter</u>, which concludes the <u>Octave of Easter</u>. It is originally based on the <u>devotion</u> to the <u>Divine</u> <u>Mercy that Faustina Kowalska</u> reported as part of her encounter with Jesus, and is associated with special promises from Jesus and <u>indulgences</u> issued by the Catholic Church.A person who goes to <u>sacramental confession</u> and receives <u>holy communion</u> on that day, shall obtain the total expiation of all sins and punishment.
